Pastor's Update for August

We had a very good conversation on Values, Mission and Vision on Sunday, 7/23, but agreed to move this part of our process to smaller groups. As a result we've changed the timeline so the groups can work and to give everyone a break from meetings!

New Time Line

August 15 – 5pm Transition Team meeting

August 22 – 5pm Transition Team meeting

August 27 – noon Congregational Conversation – Mission and Vision

August 29 – 5pm Transition Team meeting

Sept .10 – noon Congregation Conversation – Summarizing our work and determining if we can move toward a Call Committee.

Sept .11 – Begin seeking names for Call Committee.

Oct. 10 – Council approves Call Committee (note: I haven't checked the constitution, but it may require the congregation to approve the Call Committee. If so we'll do that on Oct. 8 after worship)

Oct 15 – Install Call Committee

Oct 29 – Reformation commemoration and congregational celebration!

The process still has tasks and the above timeline will be changed as necessary to finish this work:

- Finalize our Values, Mission and Vision statements
- Analyze our staffing and leadership needs. This will be done by the Transition Team and Council.
- Formalize the office procedures needed to maintain good working practices (also a Council task).
- Continue to rebuild our Parish Record – Lin Holly and Dorothy Stenman are taking this on.
- Updating the Constitution.
- Strengthening our connections with the larger Rocky Mountain Synod and the ELCA.
- Clarifying our connections with our sister congregations.

The move toward agreement with the Ecumenical Catholic Communion continues in our Catholic community. We'll keep you up-to-date as things move forward.

Event Ideas Welcome

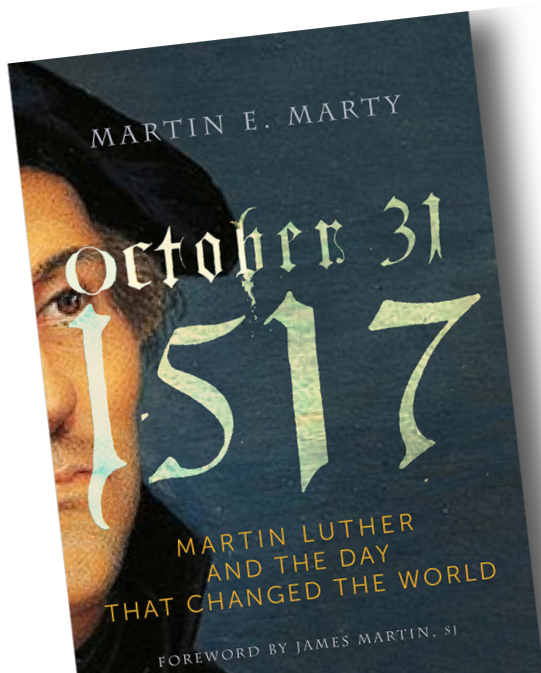
Do you have an idea for St Paul, do you want to fundraise for something, do you want to throw a party? We now have a process for that!

MUSIC AT SAINT PAUL

Cristo Rey Music, Arts, and Bible Camp *August 14 to 18*

The annual Saint Paul Music for Children Summer Music, Arts, and Bible Camp will be held this year from 14-18 August 2017 at Iglesia Luterana Cristo Rey Rey, 501 Raleigh Street, in Denver. The camp, for children from age 4 through grade 8, will offer daily classes in basic music, Orff instruments, recorders, drum playing, and art, along with recreational activities, from 9:00 am-2:00 pm. Also, a Vacation Bible School curriculum will be integrated into the schedule with the assistance of a team from Rainbow Trails. Children from Saint Paul are encouraged to participate in the camp, and adult Partners in Ministry from Saint Paul are most welcome to assist with the camp. Classes will be taught in English, so no Spanish language skills will be required either for children attending or for adults assisting. (Also, no particular skills in music or art are necessary, either!) Minutes for July 11, 2017

Pastor Penni's Report

- Next step in the transition process is to continue the Core Values Conversation on July 23.
- A motion was made and seconded that that the St. Paul Council agree to pursue the possibility of becoming a sanctuary location for immigrant advocacy in connection with Epiphany and House of All Saints and Sinners. Passed.
- Work proceeds on our by-laws and constitution together with a covenant with our Catholic Community.
- Work continues on the Parish Register, recycling water bottles, and better communication with calendars, wall notices, etc.
- Project and Event Planning Form draft presented to Council. Once approved, this form would be filled in by the person(s) requesting the activity or event and then sent to the office, the council president, and to the chair of the relevant committee for their approval and authority to proceed.
- The next meeting of the tri-church working committee is on August 9 from 5:00 to 6:30.

Father Don's Report

- Research and discussion into affiliation with the ECC (Ecumenical Catholic Communion) is progressing. There are no hurdles in the RC congregation to going forward with this affiliation process.
- There will be a meeting to help with a draft of the St. Paul by-laws that will have some coincidence with the Lutheran (ELCA) by-laws

Mark Filbert's Report

- Mark will be working with the Synod's Bible Camp at Cristo Rey from August 14-18: Music, Bible, and Art. Dena Williams is helping again with the art focus, but more volunteers are needed to help out that week. Contact Mark.
- Music at St. Paul Program: If this becomes a

paid venue, we could then pay a stipend for the work of organizing, welcoming the musicians, setting up tables for selling tickets, and other duties. Pastor Penni moved that we include a fee structure for all the groups using St. Paul so that we can compensate the organizers. Jeff, Aaron, and Mark will constitute this committee and have a letter ready to send to all the groups using our venue. Motion referred to Committee.

Committee Reports

- Lori Eastman distributed a revised draft of the Wedding Ceremony contract, which will have photos of St. Paul included.
- Brats, Beer, and Luther Maryann O'Brien will have a sign-up sheet available after both services this week and next for volunteers to help on Wed. July 26. Pastor Penni will check with Pastor Marty Lettow at Our Savior about the beer.
- Irene McCahill is organizing the next Evangelism / Outreach Meeting for Thursday, July 20.

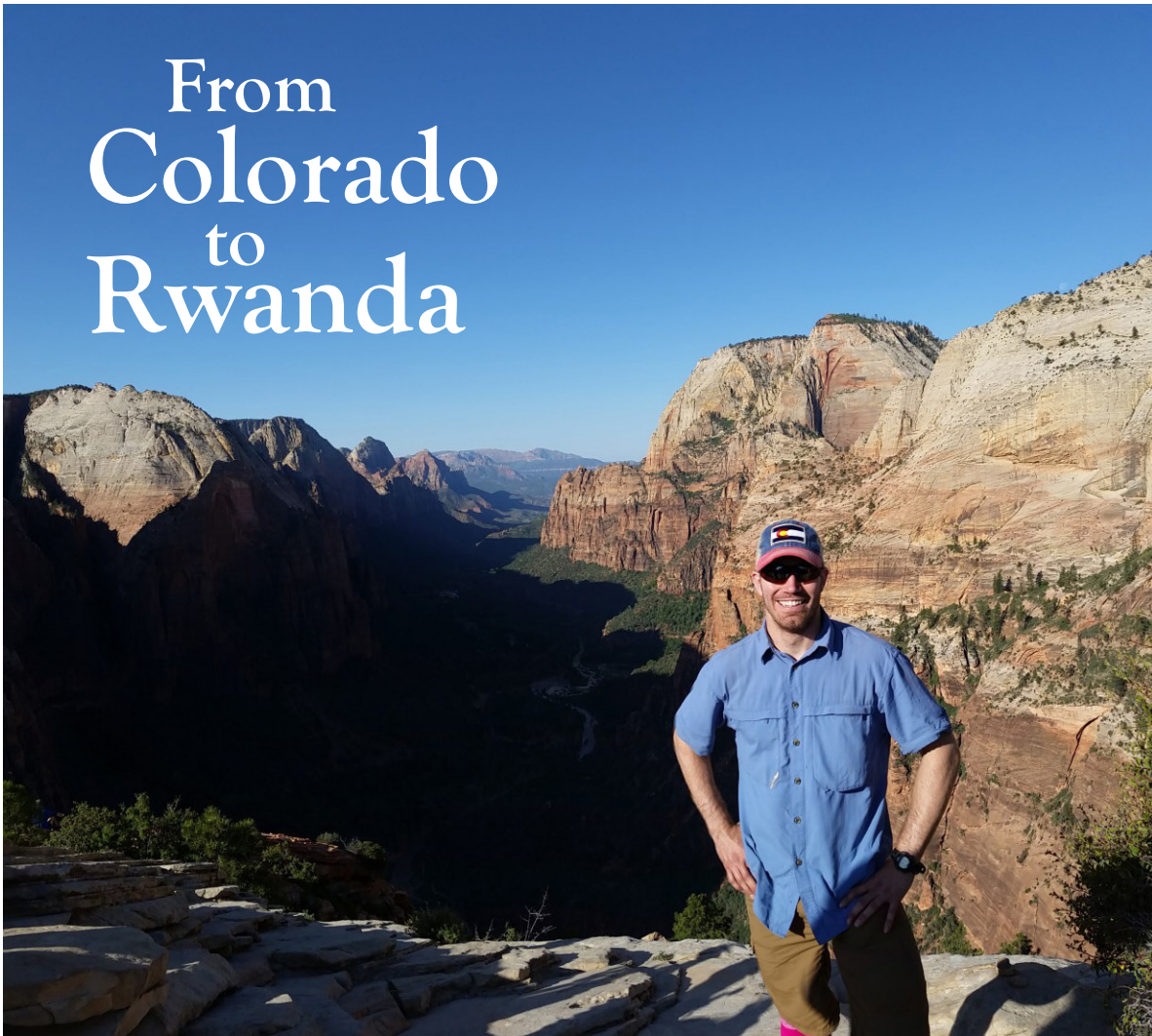
Old Business: Ratification of updated call for Cantor

From Colorado to Rwanda



Ryan Campbell has been attending services at St. Paul, but this August is leaving Denver for Africa, serving in Rwanda for a year through the ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission volunteer program. Eighty-five young people will be serving in 11 different countries, working in churches, schools and social service ministries.

Ryan's story:

"After graduating from St. Olaf College in 2013, I moved back to Colorado. I started working for a local nonprofit startup as a grant writer. That fall, I started working for Samaritan House, Catholic Charities' homeless shelter in downtown Denver. The internship ended and I was recruited for a position as a case manager in the veteran's program at Samaritan House. I've worked in that position for three years, and loved it. I've learned a lot and haven't looked back. Now it's time to look forward, and jump headfirst into the next big chapter of my life! I'm pursuing a calling to serve

abroad in Africa.

"I chose the YAGM program because I consider myself a Lutheran, and I love the work and the community of the ELCA. I was also impressed with the stories of strong support and intention that I heard from alumni. I interviewed and was chosen to serve in Rwanda, and I can't be happier as I return to Africa."

The total cost for one young adult in the program is \$15,000. Each young adult is tasked with raising a minimum of \$5,000 to help support their year of service.
