February 9, 16, and 23, the three Sundays before Lent, will be devoted to discussions from 40-Day Journey with Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Bonhoeffer was a Lutheran pastor and University Professor of Theology in Germany the first half of the 20th century.

A prolific author and letter writer, he spoke out against the Nazi regime in the 1930s and met his death because of it. If you have this book, bring it along, but there will also be handouts
